Annual Function and Prize Distribution ceremony at English Medium School and Junior College of Science run by Shri Vitthalrao Joshi Charities Trust

The annual get-together, foreign language day and prize distribution ceremony were held with great enthusiasm on 15th and 16th January 2026 at the multipurpose hall of the institution on behalf of the English Medium School and Junior College of Science run by Shri Vitthalrao Joshi Charities Trust. Mrs. Mridul Shirgurkar, a senior retired scientist from the National Chemical Laboratory, Pune, was present as the chief guest for this program. After the lighting of the lamp by the dignitaries, the program began with the Ishastavana (prayer to God) presented by the students of classes VII to IX.

Students who performed outstandingly in academics, sports, and co-curricular activities as well as in the study of foreign languages like Spanish and German, were felicitated with certificates, medals, and prizes. While interacting with the students after the prize distribution, Mrs. Shirgurkar highlighted the importance of basic science.

To take concrete steps on the health issues of adolescent students in the taluka, increasing mobile usage, and stress management for teachers, Group Education Officer of Chiplun, Mr Ernak, along with all the centre heads, visited B.K.L.
